Strengthening Families Program (Birth–3, 3–5, 6–11, 12–16)

The Strengthening Families Program is recognized for the prevention of child maltreatment and of parental and youth substance abuse, and has been reviewed and recognized by these national and international organizations:

- **CrimeSolutions, National Institute of Justice**
Rated Promising (profile posted 2011).

- **SAMHSA National Registry of Evidence-based Programs and Practices (NREPP)**
Listed as an evidence-based program for substance abuse prevention and mental health promotion.

- **Administration for Children and Families (ACF), U.S. Department of Health and Human Services**
Recognized by the Administration for Children and Families.

- **United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC)**
Included in the Compilation of Evidence-Based Family Skills Training Programmes (2010).

- **California Evidence-Based Clearinghouse for Child Welfare (CEBC)**
Promising Research Evidence (Scientific Rating 3) for substance abuse prevention; High relevance to child welfare.

- **SAMHSA Center for Substance Abuse Prevention (CSAP)**
Named a CSAP Model Program.

- **National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA)**
Selected as one of 10 exemplary prevention programs.

- **Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP)**
One of seven programs in Strengthening America's Families; featured in the OJJDP Juvenile Justice Bulletin, April 2000.
